The most popular devotion is Pampanga's Crusade of Charity and Penance, which was entrusted under the patronage of Virgen de los Remedios and initiated by Bishop Cesar Maria Guerrero, who incidentally is from Manila. With the devastation of World War II, Pampanga became a center for communism and breeding ground of socialism. There was a huge gap between rich and poor, thus peasants and farmers were up in arms against their landowners. Thus in 1952, Bishop Guerrero set the image of Nuestra Senora de los Remedios to visit every church and chapel around the diocese that brought together the faithful in prayer with non-stop recitation of the rosary.Fr. Norman's Archdiocesan Patroness from the Philippines, Virgen de los Remedios will be coming to St. John of God on October 11, 2014. SJOG FINANCIAL REPORT SUMMARY: FOR THIS FISCAL YEAR

JULY 1, 2013 TO JUNE 30, 2014

For this fiscal year July 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014 SJOG has an operating GAIN, a net GAIN of \$11,417. This operating gain is money that is in our checking account.

The SJOG account balances are listed below. Thank you for your generosity.

Here are summary numbers for fiscal year 2014 and 2013:

FISCAL YEAR ending June 30, 2014 FISCAL YEAR ending June 30, 2013

NET operating income = \$274,953 = \$272,448

NET operating expenses = \$263,536 = \$256,253

Net operating GAIN = \$11,417 Net operating Gain = \$16,195

For this report, the 2014 and 2013 income and expenses are NET amounts. Donations for painting and Donations to Sanctuary [Central America Relief] NOT INCLUDED.

INCOME

-For 2014 Fiscal Year, Offertory & hospital ministry donations are \$144,755. This is almost the same amount of donations as previous fiscal year; only \$125 difference.

-For 2014 Fiscal Year, NET Raffle Fundraiser income is \$2,092 less than last year.

-During the Fiscal year, the Archdiocese completed a review [audit] of SJOG financial records and personnel records for the 3 year period June 2011 to June 2014. SJOG passed the review. The report says SJOG in compliance with Archdiocesan guidelines.

Fund Raising Raffle

-In Dec. 2013 SJOG net income of \$25,074 from raffle fund raiser.
-In Dec. 2012 SJOG net income of \$27,166 from the raffle fund raiser.
-In Dec. 2011, SJOG net income of \$19,060 from the raffle fund raiser.
SJOG would have an operating loss every year without the raffle fund raising income.

EXPENSES

For 2014 Fiscal Year, the two largest expenses for SJOG are the salary costs for priests \$99,661 and hourly wages for lay employees, including musicians \$83,634.

-In July 2013, to comply with CA Labor laws, all Archdiocesan lay employees with annual salary of less than \$33,280 were converted to hourly wage employees. All of the lay employees at SJOG are now paid hourly wages per the Archdiocesan wage guidelines. As a result, increase of \$17,000 for lay employee wages in 2014 Fiscal Year.

-The annual salary for all Archdiocesan priests is \$35,000. **SJOG pays the salary of two priests plus extra supply priests**, so that we can have a pastor for the parish and fulfill 24/7 the duties of hospital chaplain at UCMED.

- Average monthly operating expenses for SJOG are \$21,962. The unrestricted funds in the checking and saving account will pay approx. 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ months of operating expenses.
