On the Feast of Christ the King we heard about the Kingdom of God where compassion, justice, hope peace and all goodness abides. In the Lord's Prayer, we ask that that Kingdom of God be manifest here on earth with us in our lives.

When I lived in San Roque Parish during the war in El Salvador, amidst the poverty, war and refugees, I questioned the futility of our work, a small parish engulfed by so much need. I was told that we didn't have to do it all, we just had to be a Sign of the Kingdom, a flash of hope, compassion and justice in a sad and suffering place.

Our small SJOG community, once again, is called to be present to those who fear hate crimes, arrest and deportation. As immigrant communities, especially Latino and Muslim, come together to plan their strategies and request support, may we accompany and assist them.
