Accompaniment has been a very powerful and uplifting experience for both the team members and the person receiving the support. This is feed back from an individual that 2 members of the team supported last week at her check in hearing. "Praying with the team before going into my ICE check-in and knowing that the team was there waiting for me, made me feel as if God was standing right next to me the whole time."
