

The Mission of St. John of God Church

Following the dedication of Saint John of God to healthcare workers caring for the poor and the sick, we walk the same path to minister to patients and their families, hospital staff and faculty in the UC San Francisco Medical Center to help meet Jesus Christ through our actions, charity, transparency, social justice, and inclusiveness.

Background Today's Readings

Today's readings tells us of two leprosy cures.

In the First Reading a leper, Naaman—a Samaritan and foreigner—is healed by Elisha the prophet. Namaan returned to Elisha to give thanks.

In the Gospel we hear about how Jesus, continuing on his journey to Jerusalem, heals 10 lepers. This story is a lesson about faith and reminds us that faith is sometimes found in unlikely places. Ten people afflicted with leprosy cry out to Jesus. Struck with pity, Jesus heals all 10. However, only one former leper is described as glorifying God and returning to thank Jesus. Extolling God in a loud voice, this one comes back to Jesus. He drops to the ground giving thanks. The other nine? The one who returns is a Samaritan, a foreigner. In the Jewish circles in which Jesus lived, Samaritans were looked down upon because of the differences between the two communities in their observance of Judaism. It is significant, therefore, that Jesus commends the Samaritan for his faith, which has been his salvation. Throughout Luke's Gospel, faith is found in surprising places.

Another lesson for us in this Gospel has to do with salvation. All 10 of the lepers were given the gift of healing, but in his gratitude to God for this gift, *the Samaritan found salvation*; has eyes to see what this healing means—healing of the body and soul. Our salvation is found in recognizing the gifts we have been given and knowing to whom we must offer our thanks.

Citing Pope Francis, "Like those lepers, we too need healing, each one of us. We need to be healed of our lack of confidence in ourselves, in life, in the future; we need to be healed of our fears and the vices that enslave us, of our introversion, our addictions and our attachment to games, money, television, mobile phones, to what other people think."
